



## **King Hill Recreation Area Sutton Conservation Commission**

### **General Rules of Use**

#### **Multiuse Public Land – Uses may include:**

- Hiking, backcountry skiing, snowshoeing, sledding, wildlife observation, etc.
- Snowmobiling (limited access - see below).
- Hunting and fishing.

#### **Restrictions:**

- Closed to all wheeled vehicles.
- No camping and no fires.
- No target shooting.
- No drones.

#### **Snowmobile Access Limited to:**

- The regional snowmobile trail network - Hominy Pot trail, The White Rabbit (12), The Walrus (10), and Penacook Path.
- Access to the summit of King Hill via Brillig's Run (3) and Bean Quarry Trail.
- Please respect the other recreational users and stay on allowed trails.

#### **Private Property:**

Many of the historic ski trails pass through KHR and continue onto private property. Some neighbors continue to keep these adjacent fields mowed for the benefit of wildlife, but they are not open for public use. The boundaries are clearly marked on the map and on the property. **Please respect our neighbors and stay within the bounds of the KHR Area.**

#### **General:**

- Recreate at your own risk.
- Respect other recreational users.
- Always keep pets under control, use a leash when appropriate, and **carry out all pet waste.**
- Pack in and pack out.
- Backcountry skiers should be aware that old ski lift foundations remain on some trails.
- Leave natural features, stonewalls, archaeological artifacts as found.
- Respect wildlife – observe wildlife from afar to avoid disturbing them – never enter designated wildlife management areas – never feed wildlife.
- Help control erosion - stay on the trail even if it means wet feet and stay off closed trails.
