Overview

Ausbon Sargent, an accredited and respected land trust serving a 12-town region and stewarding 174 protected properties, seeks an Outreach Coordinator to build a robust suite of community programs for the organization. We have a committed membership base that supports our mission to preserve the rural character of the Mt. Kearsarge/Ragged/Lake Sunapee region in New Hampshire. The Outreach Coordinator will build and implement programming in our region to educate the public broadly on land and the benefits of conservation. This programming may focus on ecological education, land management, or research. It may be for children or adults.

A successful Outreach Coordinator will be personable, organized, and interested in community engagement. They will have the skills and experience to connect with the public in many ways around the subject of conservation. The position requires a team player who will be part of our productive, fun, and supportive workplace.

This full-time position is on-site in our New London office with regular outside activities on our conserved properties. This position requires some evening and weekend work.

Salary: \$45,000 - \$50,000.

Benefits: health insurance, paid time off, professional development opportunities, and retirement match.

Responsibilities

- Create and execute public programs related to land conservation, ecology, and other areas as defined in the organization's strategic plan (watersheds, water resources, wildlands, active and passive working-lands management (farming, timber, etc.), regional ecological challenges and stewardship best-practices).
- Highlight the stewardship practices used by Ausbon Sargent to manage its own property.
- Coordinate workshops for landowners and conservation commissions.
- Partner with the Lake Sunapee Protective Association, other lake and pond associations, conservation organizations and town conservation commissions, government entities, educational institutions, and working-lands partners.
- Explore new engagement/educational opportunities working with schools.
- Help with public messaging around Ausbon Sargent's role as a capable community partner.
- Engage in public conversations about land use and community needs.
- Provide photos and content to the Development and Communications Coordinator for social media, website, and newsletter use.
- Manage program and activity participants: registration, communication, education, follow-up.

Qualifications and Skills

- Bachelor's degree in related field.
- Demonstrated knowledge of and passion for land conservation.
- Ability to manage multiple projects and deadlines.
- Effective oral and written skills.
- Understanding of the importance of broad public support in successful land conservation; respect for opposing viewpoints.
- Patience and understanding while working with the community.
- Strong computer skills with working knowledge of Microsoft 365 and other software.
- Ability to maintain confidentiality of sensitive information.
- Valid driver's license, proof of auto insurance, and access to a reliable vehicle.
